



KONI was founded in 1857 in the Netherlands as a manufacturer of leather equipment for horses. Just before the Second World War, the company started to work on shock absorbers. In 1955, KONI decided to play a more prominent role in motor sports in order to enlarge the company's reputation. The first Grand Prix that KONI officially participated in was in 1958 with Ferrari. After that, the business expanded quickly and in 1971, KONI achieved its first World Championship and has maintained a reputation of success ever since.
